## Four Simple Ways for Each Scout to Be Involved in Operation: Thank a Veteran

- 1. Express your interest and sign up to participate in Operation Thank a Veteran (A sign up sheet is available here tonight, or you can sign up through the <a href="https://www.bsa16.org">www.bsa16.org</a> website in a few days)
- 2. Invite someone you know that has or is currently serving in one of the military service groups to attend this honoring occasion with you and your family. The person you invite can be a parent, a grandparent, an aunt or uncle, a friend of the family, or a neighbor. (Invitations can be provided)
- 3. Sometime before November 11<sup>th</sup>, have a 20 minute conversation with the person you have invited to be honored at the Veteran Recognition Service. Talk with them about their sacrifice, roles and experiences using the sample question sheet available.
- 4. On November 11<sup>th</sup>, during the 7:00 service, we will ask you to introduce your guest, and tell the audience something special that you learned about your guest and his/her role in the military. (You can use your question sheet for this!)

Additionally, if your interested in serving by providing leadership in the following areas:

- 5. We will need some scouts who will be willing to be the Color Guard to bring in the American Flag and Church Flag at the beginning, and to carry them out at the end of the service. (This can be several scouts)
- 6. We will need a scout who will be willing to leading the Pledge of Allegiance.
- 7. We will need some scouts who will be willing to read a short scripture from the Old and New Testament. (Can be 1 or 2 different scouts)
- 8. We will need some scouts who will be willing to read a short opening prayer, and a short closing prayer. (Can be 1 or 2 different scouts)
